### **S - Scriptures**

### **C - Consideration**

The verse above is the words of a woman, who hosted Elisha, the prophet, and his helper every time they would come to her town. The man of God had prayed for her and she conceived and gave birth to a son. However, years later, “The child grew, and one day he went out to his father, who was with the reapers. He said to his father, “My head! My head!” His father told a servant, “Carry him to his mother.” After the servant had lifted him up and carried him to his mother, the boy sat on her lap until noon, and then he died.” She called her husband and said, “Please send me one of the servants and a donkey so I can go to the man of God quickly and return.” “Why go to him today?” he asked. “It’s not the New Moon or the Sabbath.” “That’s all right,” she said.”

### **C – Commitment**

This woman has so much to teach us. The first thing that I noted in her life was spiritual discernment to recognize a true prophet of God. She kept observing Elisha as he walked by, “She said to her husband, “I know that this man who often comes our way is a holy man of God. “ The second thing she did was to take action to serve the prophet of God, “Let’s make a small room on the roof and put in it a bed and a table, a chair and a lamp for him. Then he can stay there whenever he comes to us.” The third thing is the amazing faith she had. In the midst of a terrible tragedy, she kept her tears, controlled her emotions, spoke words of faith, and again took action. She went after the prophet who came to her house to pray for her son, “The boy sneezed seven times and opened his eyes. When she came, he said, “Take your son.” While on this planet we always have to make choices. We can choose to follow godly or ungodly people, to give or to take, to believe or to complain, to confess victory or to confess defeat, to hope or to live in despair, to be like the mentioned woman, or to follow our natural perception. Let’s choose the first. Let’s get up every morning saying, “Everything is all right,”
